Celebrating Excellence in Georgia

When abused and neglected children are removed from their families, friends and familiar surroundings and placed in foster care, they are very frightened and intimidated by the process they must go through and frequently, due to overburdened workers in the child welfare system, have no one but their CASA volunteers to ensure the courts have heard their best interests.

Everyday, all across Georgia, CASA volunteers, board members and staff work together to ensure these children are placed in safe, permanent homes where they can thrive. On the front lines, CASA volunteers gather information about the circumstances of the children, inform the courts about needed services, including recommendations for permanent living placements, and support the children until their cases are closed.

CASA volunteers, board members and staff achieve excellence in the work they do each day, ultimately to better the lives of thousands of Georgia's children. Georgia CASA supports the work of its affiliate programs and continues to develop new affiliate programs in the state so every child who needs a CASA volunteer will have one.

Here we celebrate five individuals and/or affiliate programs that were recognized nationally or statewide on behalf of their excellent efforts for children.

Connie Stephens, Executive Director, Hall-Dawson CASA National Program Director of the Year

Connie Stephens was awarded the 2007 Kappa Alpha Theta Program Director of the Year by the National CASA Association. She received the award in June at the National CASA Conference in Orlando, FL.

The director of Hall-Dawson CASA since the affiliate started in 1989, Connie is widely recognized in her community and across the state for her passion, creativity and dedication to helping children. She serves as a role model for affiliate program directors and is a leader in sharing best practices around the administration of a program.

Hall-Dawson CASA has approximately 125 CASA volunteers who serve 100% of the abused and neglected children who enter court. The CASA affiliate has begun a capitol campaign to buy its own house to use for program administration as well as for visitation and training space.

Thank you for your support of CASA in Georgia. You are important to our work and ultimately to Georgia's children. We anticipate sharing many future successes with you.

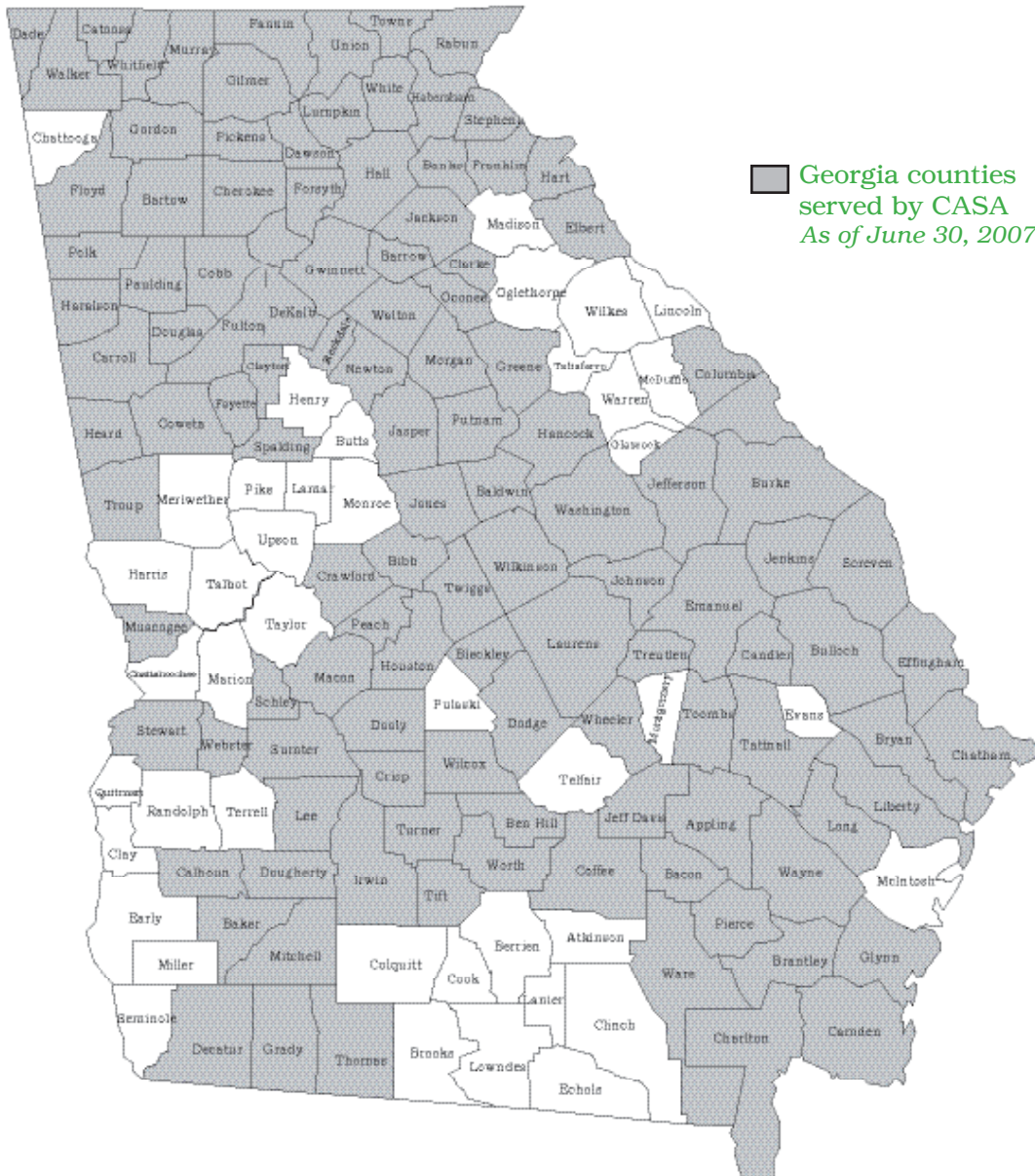

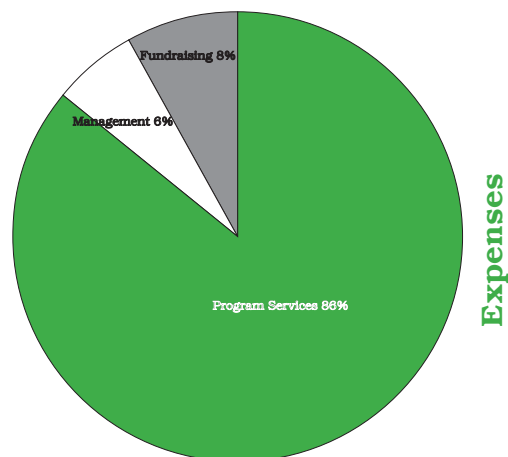
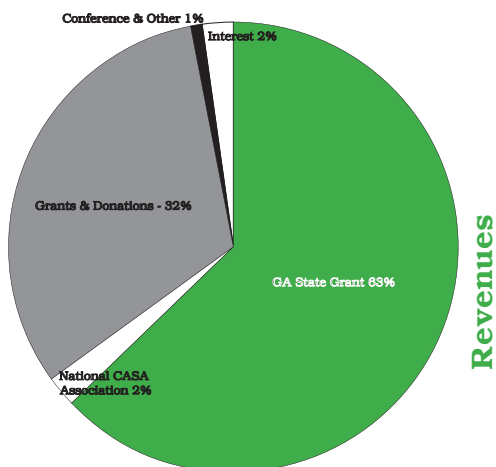

Legislative Headlines

CASA and Foster Youth Day Held at the Capitol

CASA volunteers, staff and board members, along with foster youth from the Independent Living Program, met in Atlanta at the Capitol on February 8, 2007. The primary focus of the day was to educate legislators to support CASA House Bill 270 and the work of the CASA organization.

CASA House Bill 270 Signed into Law

The Georgia General Assembly unanimously passed CASA House Bill 270 in spring 2007. The bill clarifies the advocacy role of CASA and outlines the responsibilities and limitations of CASA volunteers.

State Funding Increase Received

The CASA organization in Georgia received \$225,000 in additional state funding for a total of \$1,700,000 for fiscal year 2008.

Recruitment & Communications Headlines

Metro Atlanta CASA Recruitment Campaign Piloted

In summer 2006, the Metro Atlanta CASA Collaborative (Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Fulton and Gwinnett counties, along with Georgia CASA) piloted a volunteer recruitment campaign that included radio ads, a newspaper ad, metro brochures in public libraries and a new web site (www.metrocasa.org). Over 15 metro orientations were held for potential volunteers to attend to learn more about CASA and ways they could help. As a result of the highly successful campaign, initial inquiries increased by 220%, where over half of the people attended an orientation. Sixty-one new CASA volunteers were sworn-in to serve 83 new children. The overwhelming response to the campaign led to the first ever metro CASA volunteer training class, held in November and December 2006. An additional 20 CASA volunteers were trained in the metro class.

E-Newsletter Made Debut

Georgia CASA debuted its first edition of the *CASA Online Connector* in April 2007. The quarterly e-newsletter replaced the previously printed *Connector* newsletter. Each issue includes a short synopsis of recent CASA happenings in the state, links to specific child abuse/neglect resources, upcoming events/conferences and donors for the quarter. The e-newsletter is sent to over 3,000 recipients. Issues of the e-newsletter are also available on Georgia CASA's website.

Affiliate Related Headlines

Two New Affiliate CASA Programs Began in South Georgia

S.A.F.E. CASA, housed in Waycross, was established to serve Bacon, Brantley, Charlton, Coffee, Pierce and Ware counties.

South Central CASA, led from Cordele, was established to serve Ben Hill, Crisp, Dooly and Wilcox counties.

CASA Expanded in Atlantic Judicial Circuit

Atlantic Area CASA expanded its services into Bryan and Tattnall counties in Southeast Georgia.

*9,065 children were served by 1,818 CASA volunteers in fiscal year 2007.
CASA affiliate programs were present in 44 of 49 judicial circuits
and 117 counties in the state.*

3rd Annual Georgia CASA Luncheon & Fashion Show Raised Over \$31,500

On March 14, 2007, over 200 people attended the luncheon & fashion show at Maggiano's in Buckhead and enjoyed fashions from several Buckhead boutiques. The celebrity model was media personality Holly Firfer. Other models included two CASA board members, an affiliate program director and a DFCS director. Ted Hall of WXIA-TV served as emcee. The event also included a popular raffle with six prize packages.

Georgia CASA continued its three-year, \$3.6 million capacity building campaign, with \$1.7 million pledged (47% of the goal).

Training Headlines

Georgia CASA Hosted "Painting a Brighter Future" State Conference on April 28, 2007

Keynote speaker R. Michael Key, Troup County Juvenile Court Judge, challenged and inspired over 400 CASA volunteers, staff and board members from across the state to help "paint a brighter future" for the abused and neglected children served by CASA at the annual Georgia CASA State Conference. Attendees also had the opportunity to participate in dynamic workshops by leaders in the child welfare field. The 2006 CASA Volunteer of the Year in Georgia was awarded, along with three Awards of Excellence to affiliate programs. The Georgia Supreme Court Committee on Justice for Children was a conference sponsor.

Trainings Offered to Affiliate Programs

A major support service Georgia CASA provides to affiliate programs is training. Throughout the year, various training courses were offered, such as the following:

- Council of Programs - director meetings
- Training of the Facilitator and Volunteer Supervisor Training -
- CASA curriculum training for volunteer coordinators
- Fundraising Training - for staff and board members
- Orientation to Georgia CASA - for new CASA leadership across the state

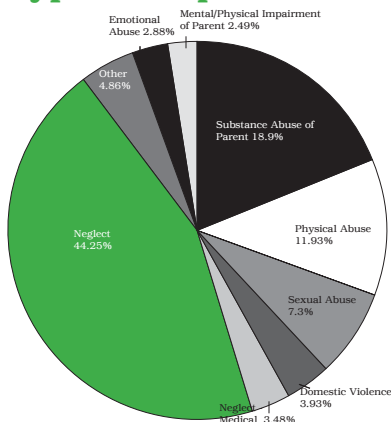

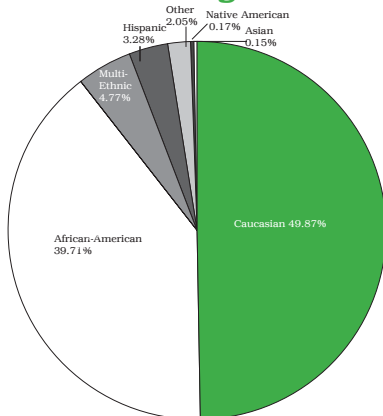

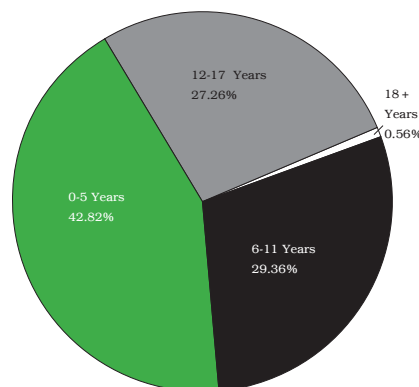
Types of Deprivation

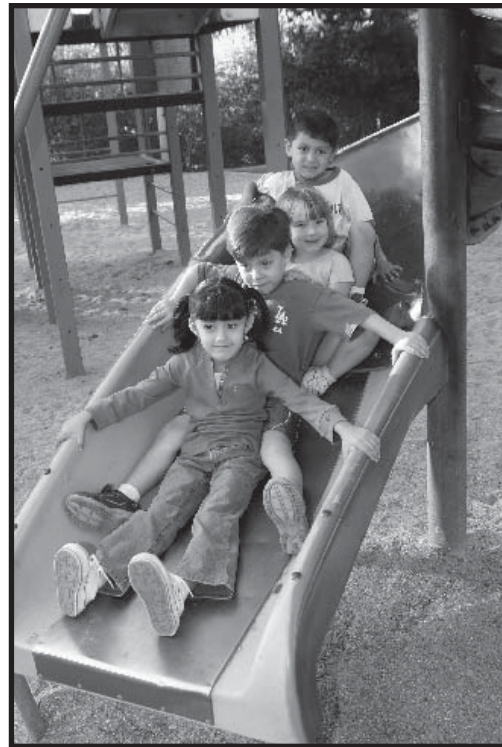

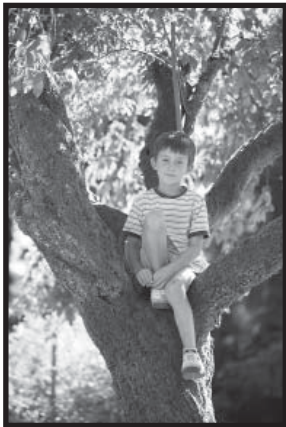
